A SUSTAINABLE BLUE ECONOMY:

Restores, protects and maintains the diversity, productivity, resilience, core functions, and intrinsic value of marine ecosystems — the natural capital upon which its prosperity depends.

Is based on clean technologies, renewable energy, and circular material flows to secure economic and social stability over time, while keeping within the limits of one planet.

Provides social and economic benefits for current and future generations by contributing to

food security, poverty eradication, livelihoods, income, employment, health, safety, equity, and political stability.





The Knowledge System







1. Government

Played a leading role in design of BE, weak knowledge system has disempowered & slowed innovative progress

...we have too many policies, we need now to implement them... synergies... promote sustainable practices

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But we should think outside the box for blue economy much more than we're doing now If we want to actually expand on the blue economy concept and how we will go in the future, science based evidence is quite key for us to move ahead

2. Local Community

Concept of the BE remains
vague, but NGOs & ocean
champions are progressing the
BE, no coordinated knowledge
of innovation

...there are some pretty wonderful things happening, business startups, NGOs ...

You can't develop a blue economy, with just the government.

Everybody needs to be involved in it

Blue economy in Seychelles, sometimes I think it's already a big thing. But in a way it is still small, because the actors are not really showing it's happening

3. Local BE Agenda

A functional local knowledge system can empower government to proactively drive innovative development of a local BE agenda that is not driven by external priorities & pressure

...the direction of the blue economy then becomes driven very much by where people are willing to put their money

4. Financing and Entrepreneurship

An accessible and formal knowledge system can enable a more certain economic future for ocean entrepreneurs wanting to take risks



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There are many more doors for research that would include investors, and entrepreneurs, and innovators

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No, that's not exactly the case, we've got a few species that are flourishing, but most of the others that you mentioned, do not exist here

Youth, culture and early career ocean professionals

...on islands if we are troubled, we don't go see a therapist.

We're gonna sit by the sea and the ocean speaks to us. And when you leave the problem is still there, but you feel better

You won't have a sustainable blue economy without the youth because they are the driving force of it ...youth is the driving force of everything

When I talk about technology I'm always very interested, and I'm always a bit like, skeptical because it has to be useful and low carbon ..."

...they are not speaking to the generation of tomorrow. They are speaking to the generation of now. You cannot look at a young person in the eye and say I am speaking for future generations.
