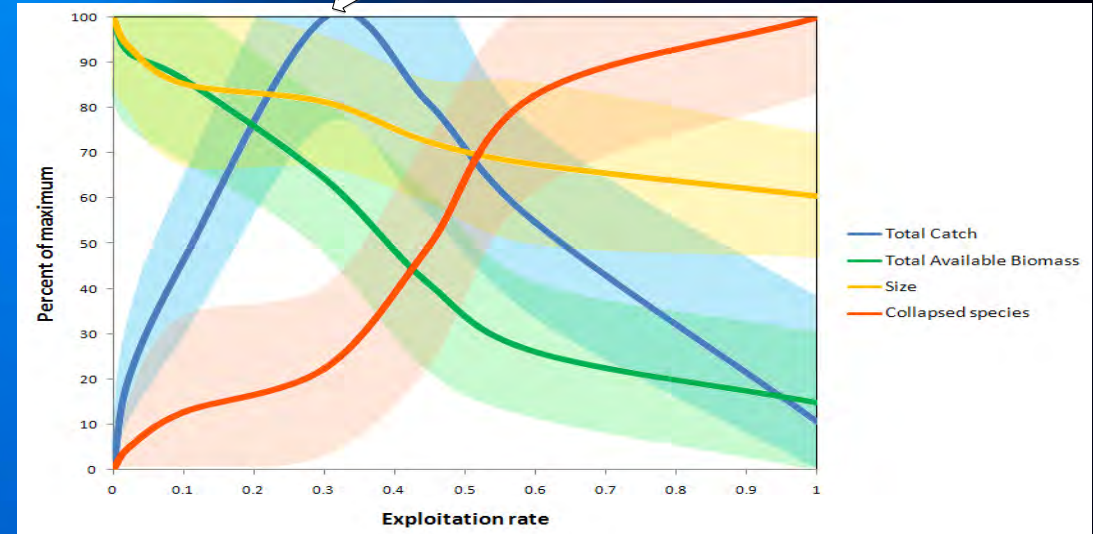

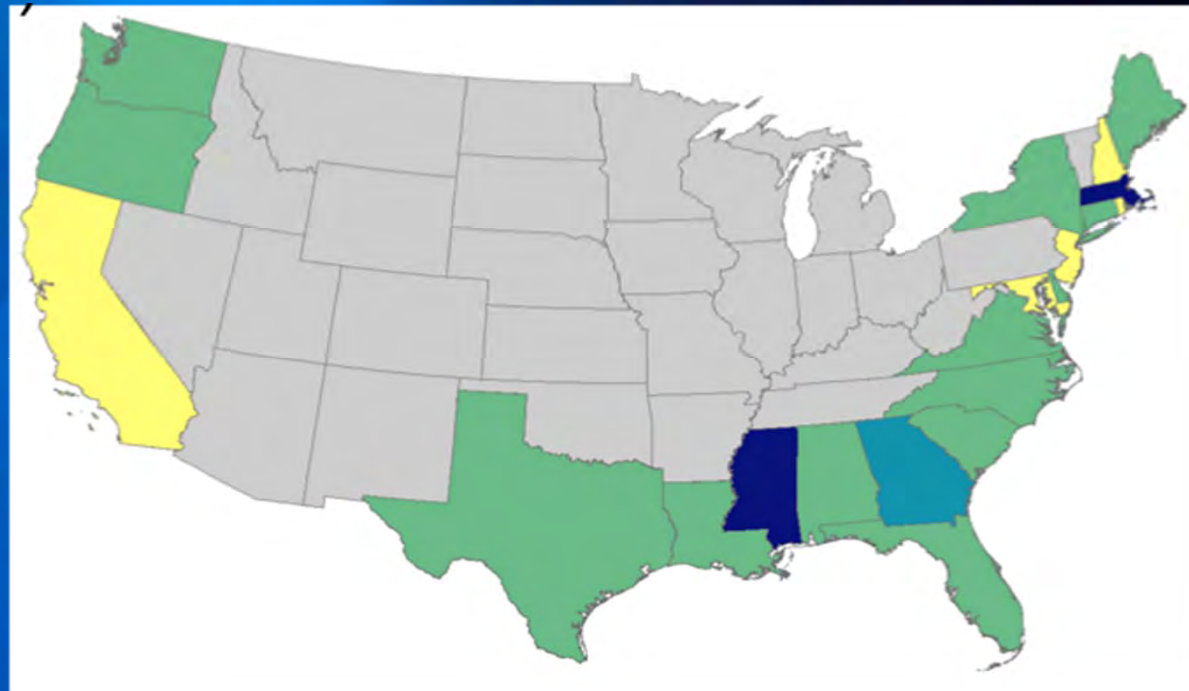

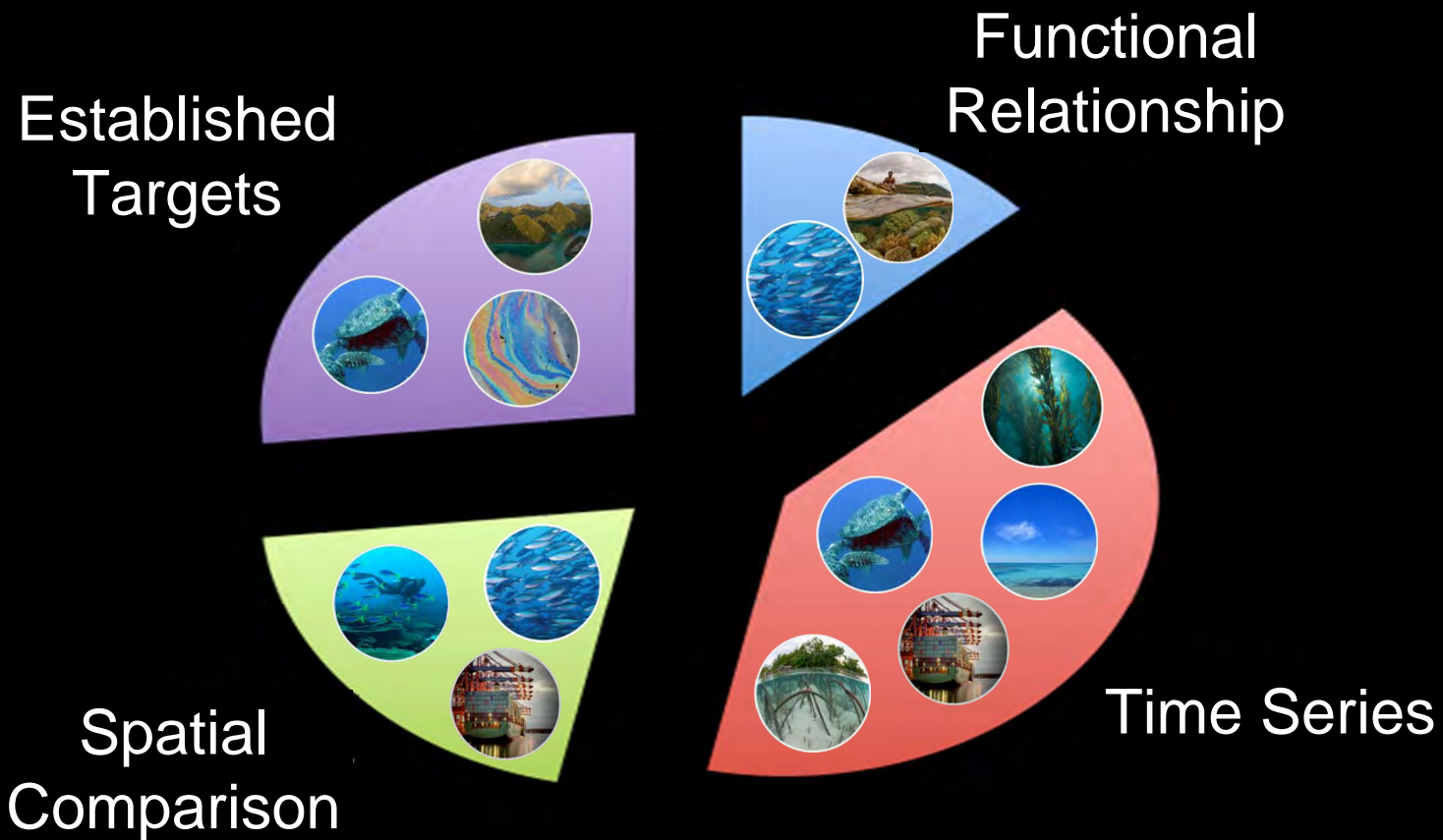
# Selecting the right type of reference point

- Measurable
- Ambitious
- Realistic
- Time-bound

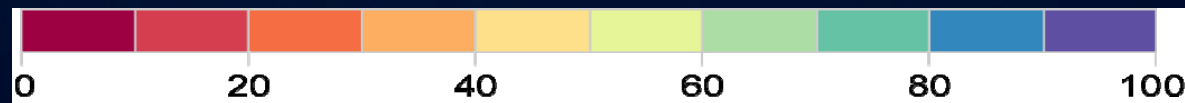
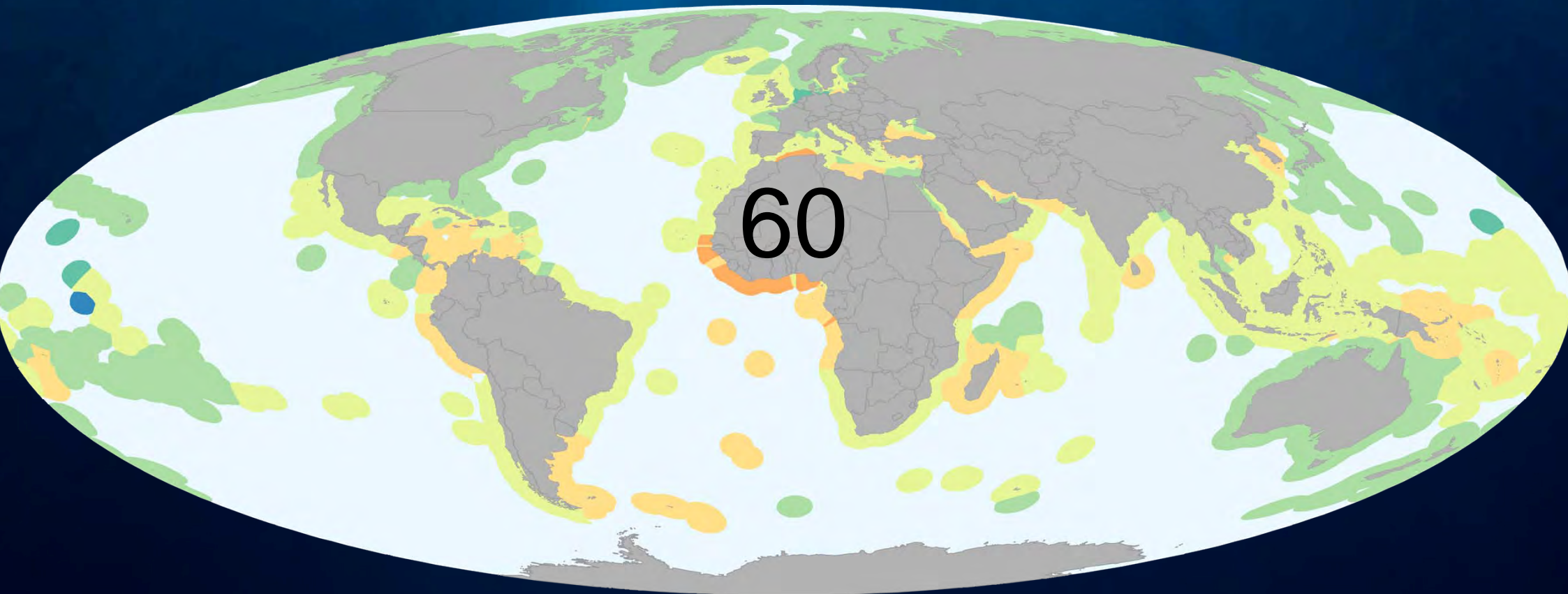
## Pressures
