# **2019 Governing Council Decisions**

(The following decisions were taken at the Intersessional Governing Council Meeting in Yokohama, Japan April 21, 2019.)

## 2019/A/1: Recommendation to increase Annual Fees in 2020

Council reviewed the options presented. Four Contracting Parties (Canada, Japan, Korea and the U.S.A.) agreed to the proposal to temporarily increase the annual fees paid by each Contracting Party by \$8000 CAD per year until the Pension Plan liability is discharged, beginning in 2020. This additional amount would be shown separately from the "regular" annual fees and would not be subject to the practice of annual increases by the rate of inflation in Canada. This extra payment would be eliminated when the Pension Plan liability is discharged at which time the Organization would return to the regular pattern of annual fees. Two Contracting Parties (China and Russia) were unable to confirm their support at the time of the meeting. **Due to lack of consensus, no decision to increase fees was made. China and Russia were requested to review this proposal with their national authorities and report back to the Chairman and Executive Secretary within one month.**
