- □ Dr. Charles Trick is a professor in the Department of Physical and Environmental Sciences at the University of Toronto. His area of expertise is harmful phytoplankton in both marine and freshwater environments, as well as the human factors contributing to toxic blooms. Before January, he served as the Director of the Institute for Inclusive Health and Well-being, where he concentrated on the effects of environmental changes on individuals and communities.
